Suggested answers to vocabulary brainstorming

Types of accommodation – apartment, (terraced/ semi-detached/ detached/ shared) house, hostel, hotel, B&B, (student) halls/ dorm(itory), condo(minium), high rise, tower block, housing estate

Different ways of addressing someone – first name/ Christian name/ given name, title + family name/ last name, nickname

Different kinds of identification – passport, driving license, photo ID, national identity card,

Family members - _____-in-law, stepmother/father, cousin, fiancé/ fiancée, partner, great grandparent, niece/ nephew, distant relation, ancestor, great uncle/ aunt

Things that families do – argue/ row/ quarrel, tease, fight, nag, scold, punish, bully, be strict, celebrate, sit down for dinner together, have a picnic, go out for a daytrip

Other people you know – acquaintance, workmate/ colleague/ co-worker, classmate, drinking buddy, fellow alumni

Housework – do the washing/ laundry, do the cleaning/ dusting/ hoovering/, do the washing up/ dishes, tidy up, take out the rubbish, hang out the washing, do the ironing, spring clean

Things to do in the evening at home – watch TV/ channel hopping, watch a movie/ go to the cinema, go to bed early, social networking, surfing the internet

Things to do at the weekend at home – do the housework, have a lie-in/ catch up on my sleep, gardening, DIY

Places to go out – club/ disco, pub/ bar, music venue/ concert venue

Educational institutions – cram school, primary school, kindergarten/ nursery/ pre-school, uni(versity), graduate school, (technical/ vocational) college

Qualifications – school leaving certificate, BA/ BSc/ bachelor's degree/ first degree/ four year degree/ university degree/ undergraduate degree, junior college degree/ two year degree, master's degree/ master's/ MA/ MSc/ MPhil/ MBA, postgraduate degree, PhD/ doctorate, post-doc,

Types of transport – bus/ coach, underground/ subway, tram, on foot, scooter, bullet train, shuttle bus, monorail

Entertainment – TV, mp3 player, live music, karaoke

Ways of cooking – boil, bake, fry, roast, steam, grill, raw, poach, stir fry
